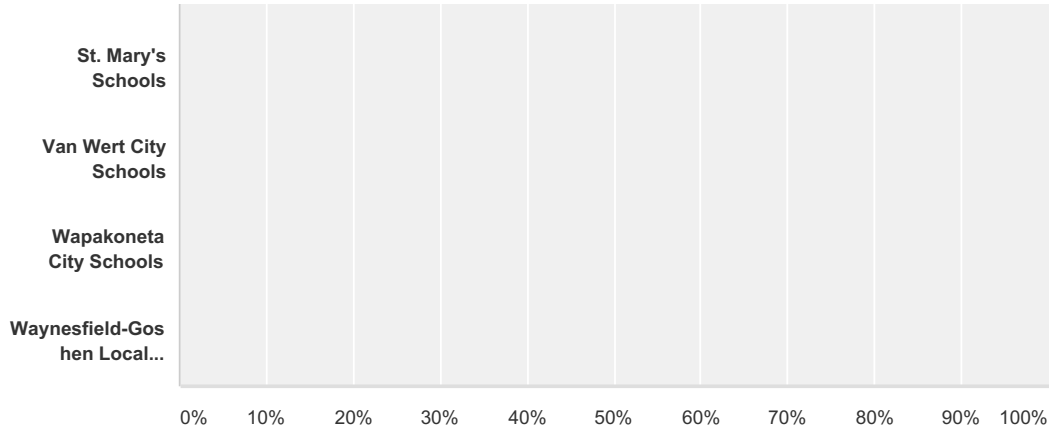

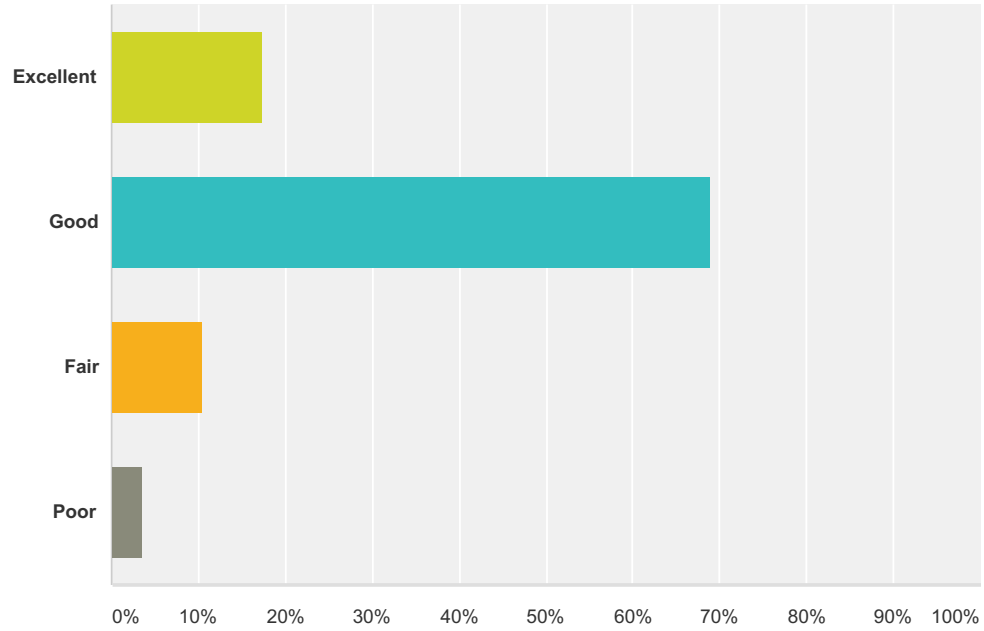

Q2 Thinking about your local public school district, how do you think it is doing in preparing children for their future?

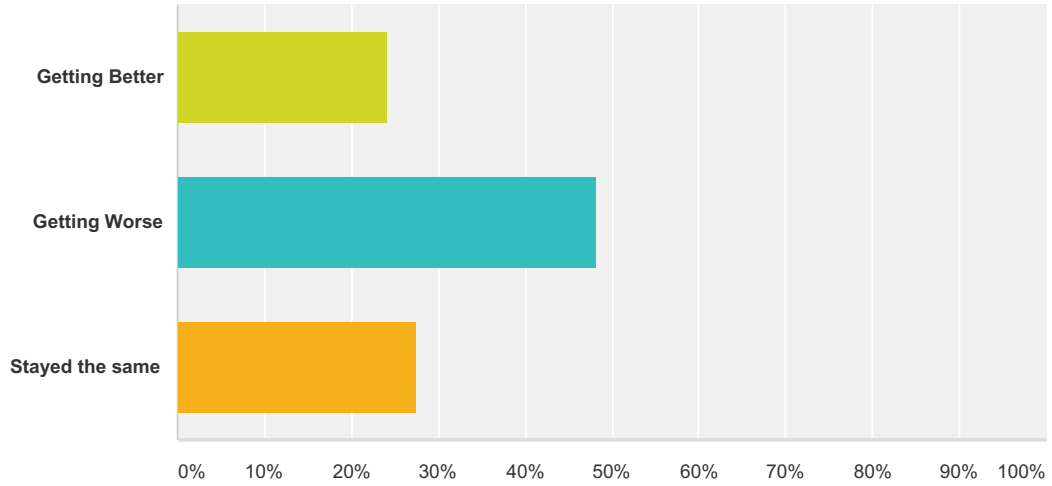

Q3 In your opinion, is K through 12 public education getting better, worse, or has stayed the same over the last 5 years?

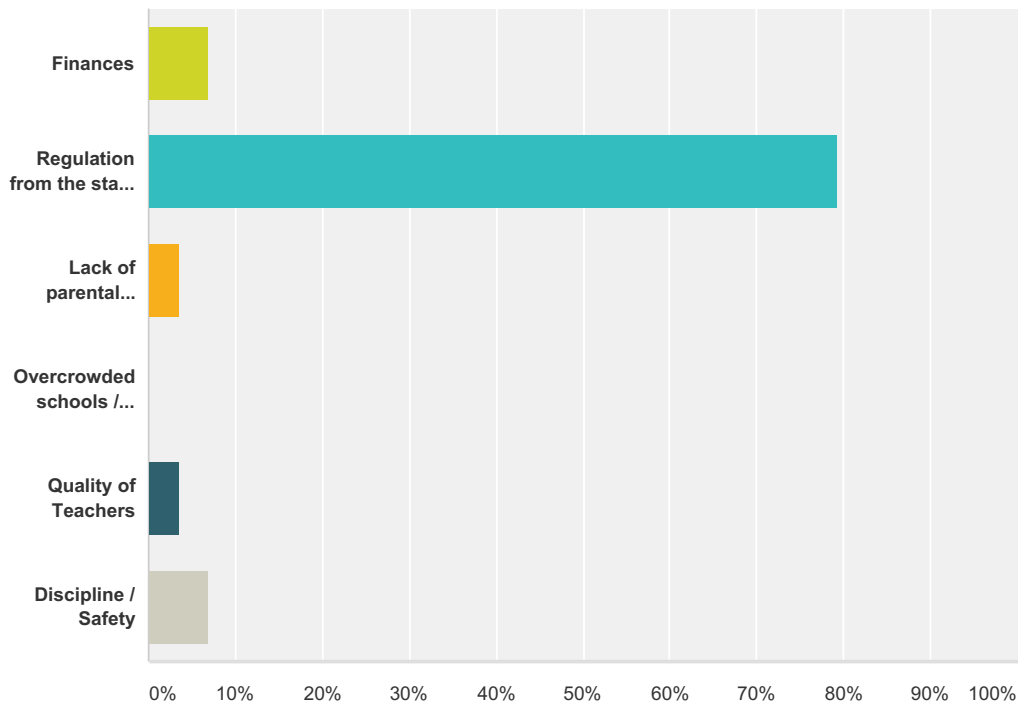

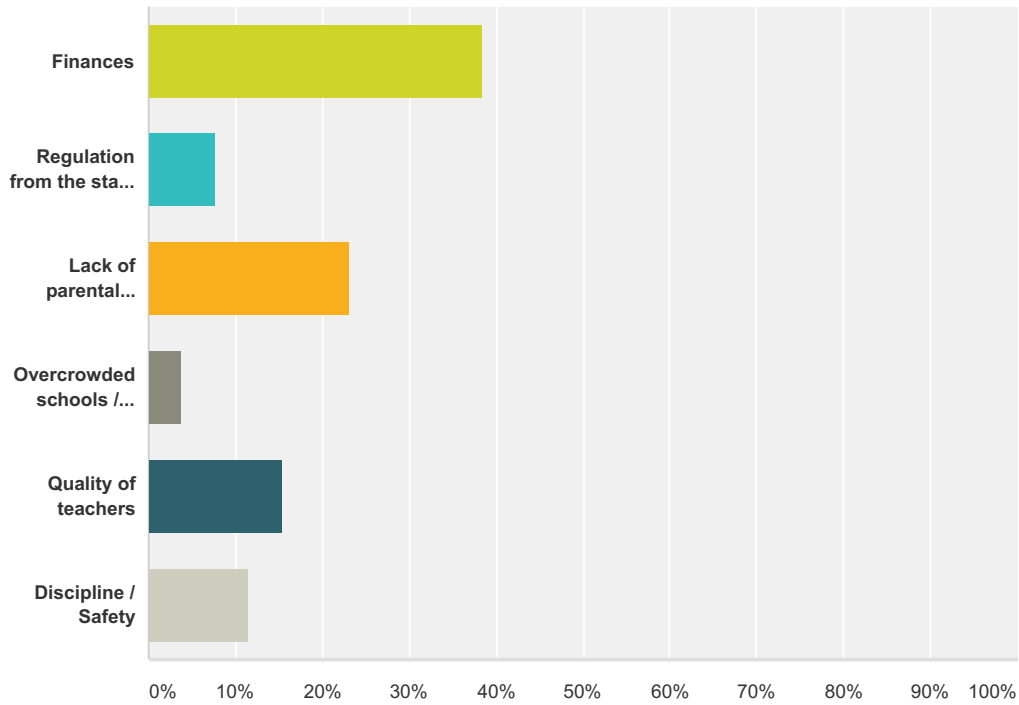

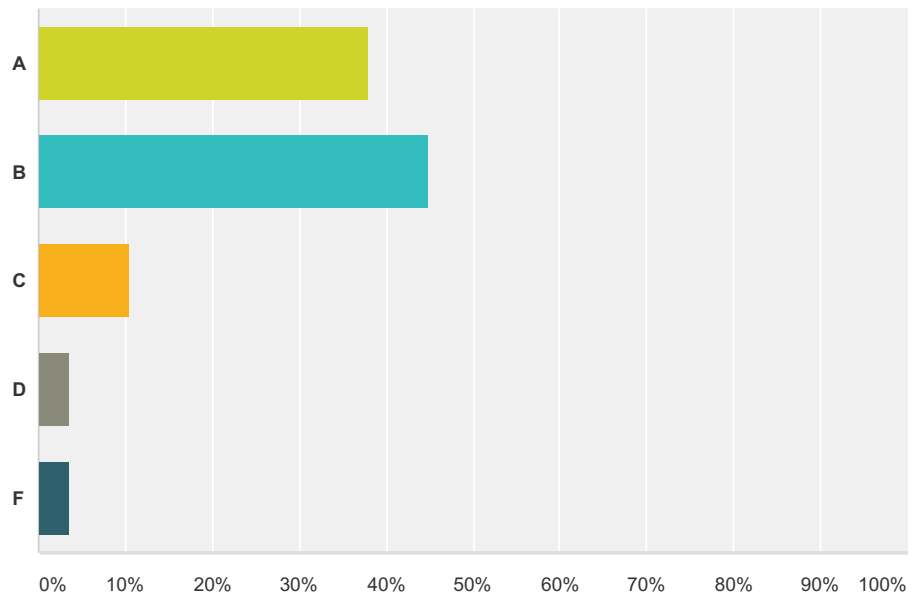

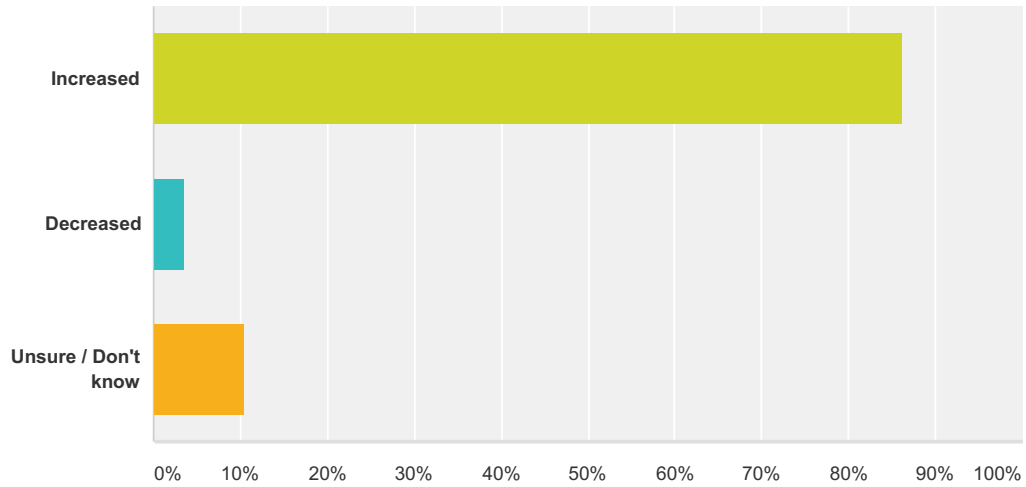

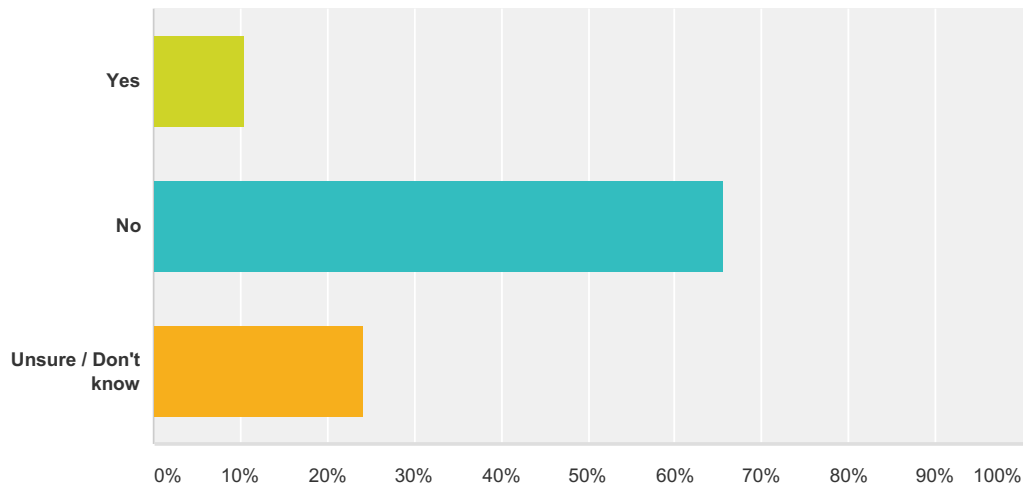

Q8 Should scores from standardized tests be a part of the teacher evaluation process?

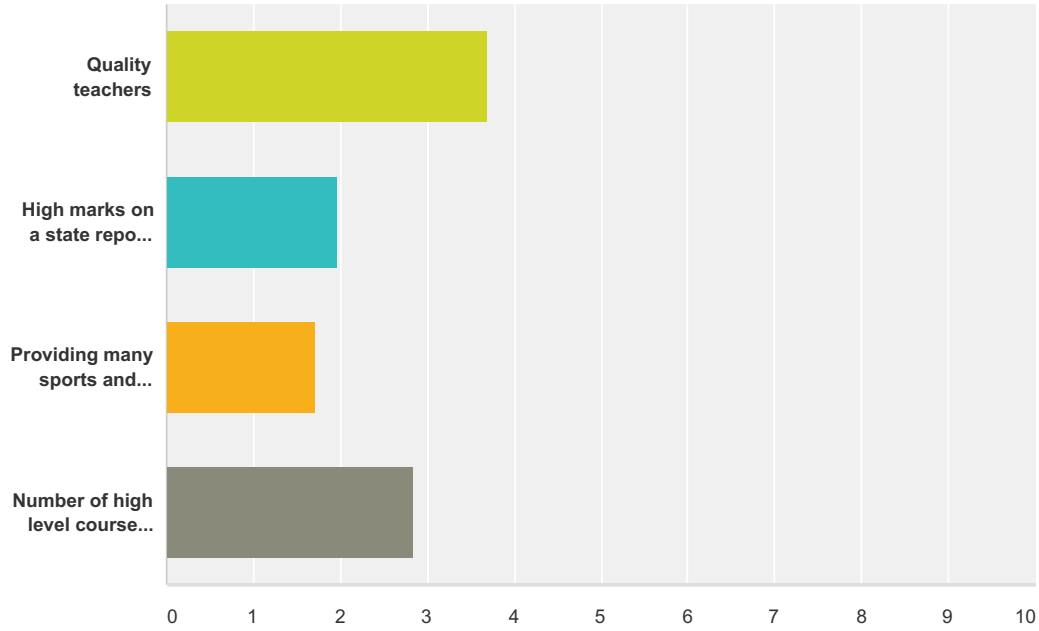

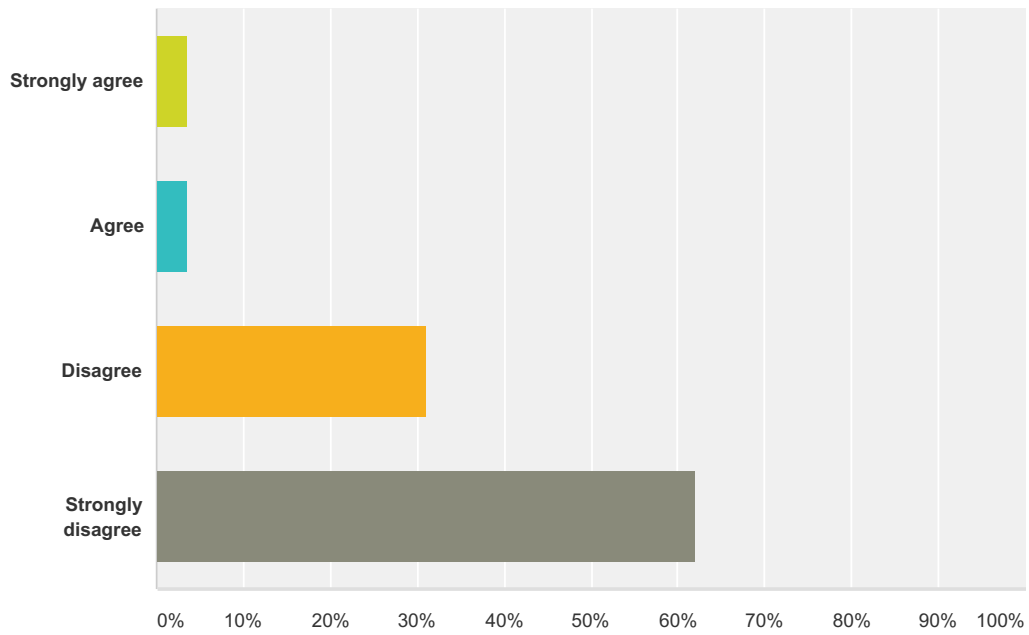

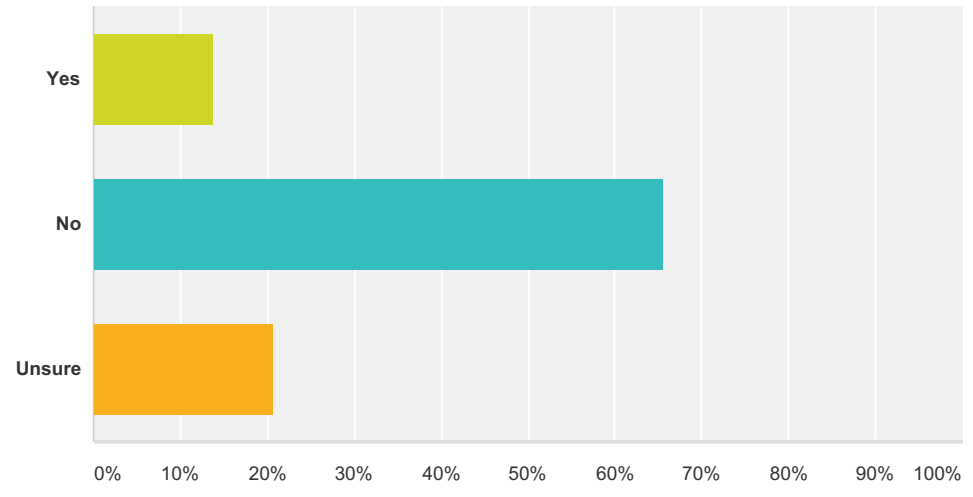

Q12 Should parents and students who choose private schools be able to use publicly supported vouchers / tax dollars to pay for that choice?

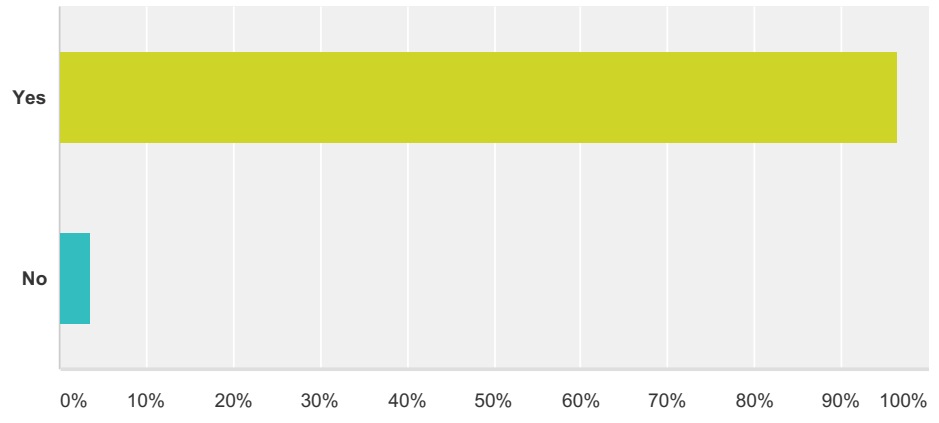

Q13 Should any school receiving public tax dollars be held to the same standards of transparency and accountability as your local public school?

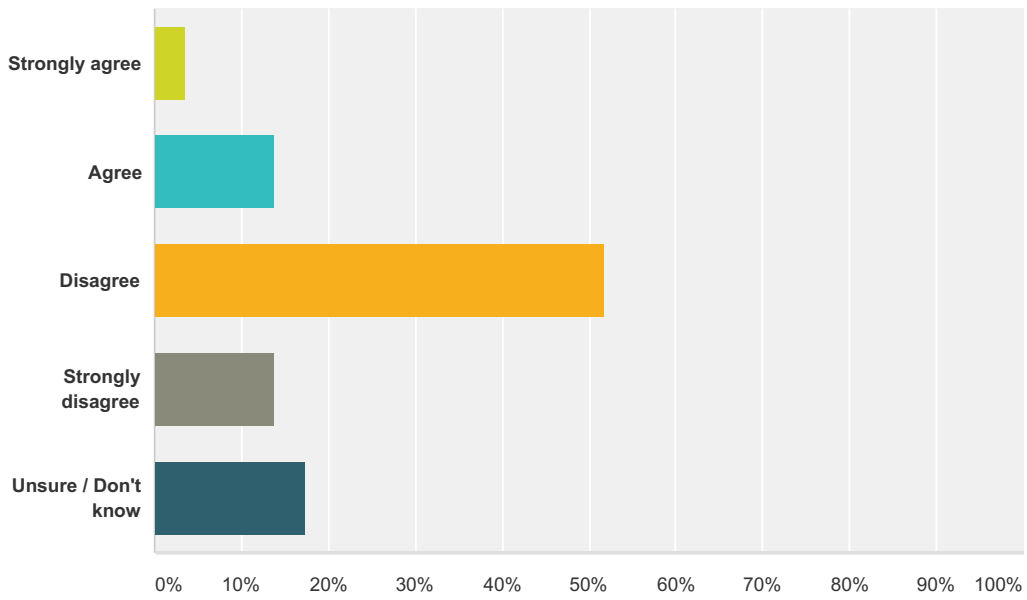

Q14 Policy decisions at the state level are in the best interest of our local schools.

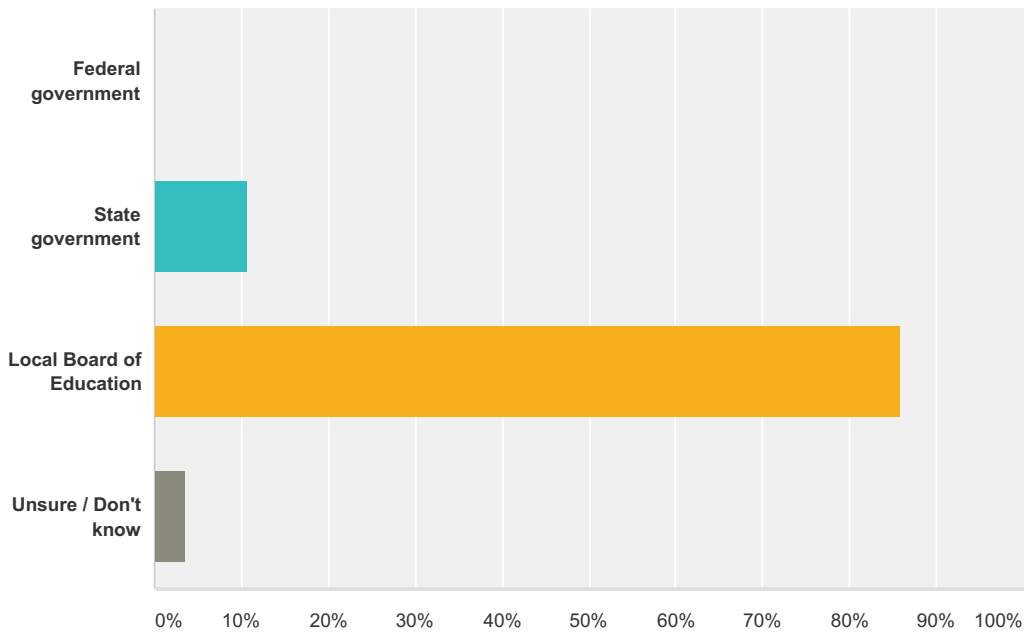

Q15 Who should control your local school district?

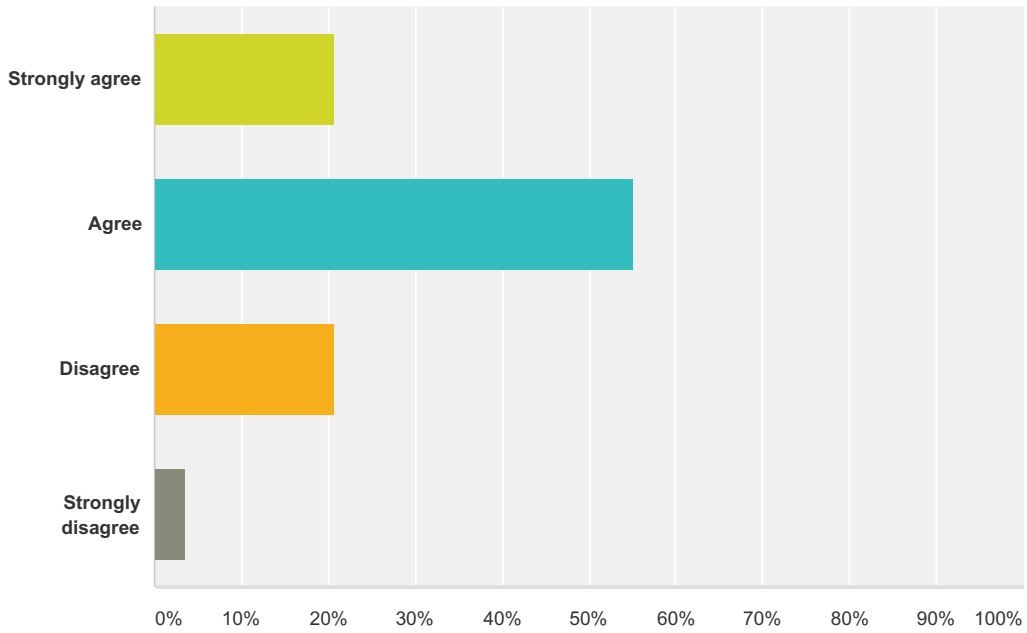

Q16 I feel connected to my local school.

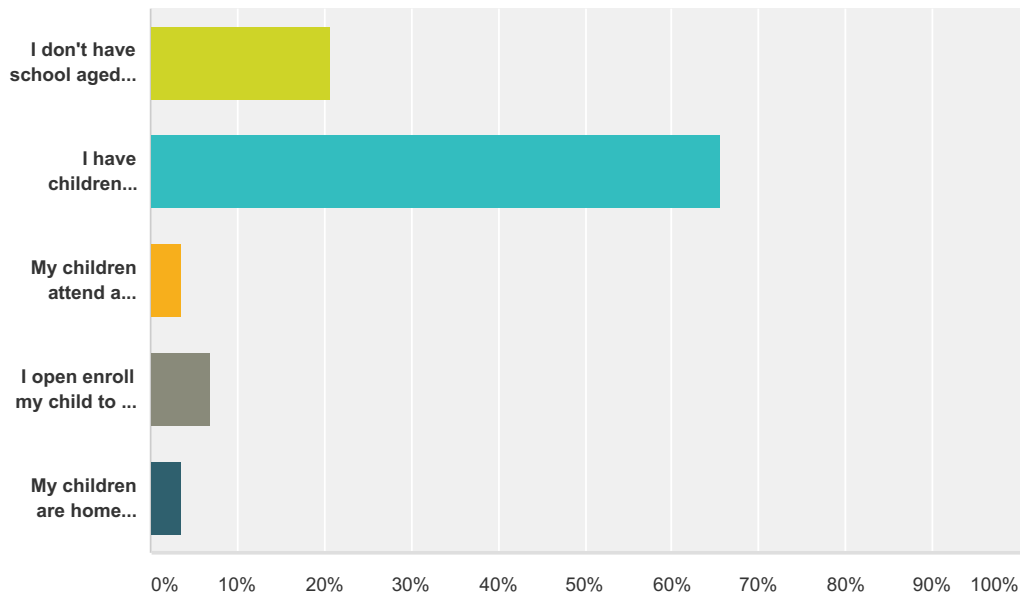
